The Lloydminster Healthcare Auxiliary began as *The Hospital Aid program* in 1932. Due to the demands of war, this program was disbanded in 1940. In 1949, efforts were reorganized, and the group became known as the *Lloydminster Hospital Auxiliary*. In 1975, the group was renamed the *Lloydminster Healthcare Auxiliary*. This group of dedicated volunteers are some of the "original" Hospital fundraisers. Funds are raised through bake sales, teas, raffles, and selling handmade items through the Auxiliary Showcase in Lloydminster Hospital's LRHF Gift Shop.
