An interactive mural for the community is to be painted on the north side of the Prairie North Plaza as part of Truth and Reconciliation. To celebrate kindness, love, and indigenous culture in our community and surrounding area and serve at a landmark location as a pillar of symbolism and hope. The selected applicants will help in the installation of this mural and become a permanent part of our community's history.

The Artistic Mentorship Program is directed towards individuals with a passion for the arts and those wanting to bring awareness of Truth and Reconciliation.

• Applicants must be from within the Lloydminster region, but can be studying at any accredited post-secondary institution, trade or vocational school or professional development.

All applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be of First Nations, Inuit or Metis heritage
- Must be 17 years of age or older (if under 18 parental consent is required)
- Must have own transportation to mural location
- Must be available from June 25th, 2023- July 17th, 2023
- Must be available for planning and mentorship for 10 hours of training prior to project installation
- Must be willing to take scissor lift training and certification and not afraid of heights
- Physically able to practice laborious activity for 8-12 hours a day and a full commitment to showing up for the installation of the Choose Love and Join Hands Mural Project.
